Staffing

I just want to say that ASAS are so lucky to have such a fantastic team of leaders and volunteers, every year more and more people help out, some start at 14 years old and stay for many years, for some it's an opportunity to gain experience and valuable life skills, others leave for studies or careers and return many years later as they've missed being part of the ASAS family.

Liam Sanders, our scheme Nurse and Assistant Project Manager, has recently undertaken additional training and has qualified as a climbing instructor, instructor in many other outdoor pursuits and Pool Emergency Responder, in order to help deliver activity sessions for ASAS as well as cutting down on costs, we are very grateful to have him on our team and I'm sure that everyone who has come into contact with him will agree making things possible for every child is his main goal in life and always goes that extra mile to make it doable.

Joy Winnard currently works 8 hours per week for ASAS doing volunteer recruitment and vetting; carrying out DBS checks, following up on references and sending out forms and information to parents, as well as attending training, play schemes and representing ASAS at events. Future Funding

We currently receive grants from Leeds City Council to deliver our play schemes, activity days and residential short breaks, from April 2020 this is changing for the residentials to being a Contract for 3 years which we will have to bid for, we are just waiting for the specification and application to be finalized and published, we will then need to work on our bid so any feedback from parents of children who have attended our residentials would be appreciated so we can show the need for more and how ASAS have provided a quality and bespoke service to children with disabilities. The benefit of it being a contract is it will be guaranteed for a longer period of time so will give us more long-term stability. Funding for play schemes and activity days will remain as grant applications which we will have to apply for and they are hoping to make this for 2 years.
